On average, in 2018, the cost of holding people in federal custody was \$102.60 per day per adult, or \$37,449 a year.

The average cost for psychiatric treatment in a community hospital ranges from \$3,616 to \$8,509, depending on the type of illness being treated. A simple calculation reveals that for an adult, the cost of 35 to 83 days in prison would provide the financing of a hospitalization that would have a better chance of bringing about recovery.

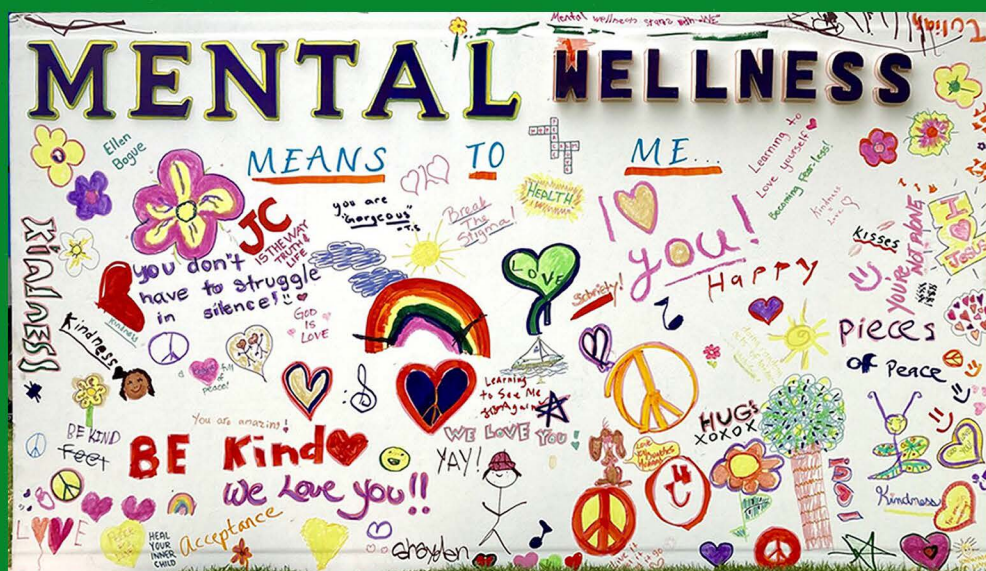
Turning Point Foundation's overall goal is to improve the quality of life, health and well-being of adults struggling with mental illness. TPF offers healing, haven and hope for some of the vulnerable and underserved populations in Ventura County. Mental illness can touch anyone, regardless of their race, culture, income, age, or level of education. It affects one in four adults and one in ten children each year. We work with clients to reverse the devastating effects of their illnesses, such as job loss, homelessness, isolation, addiction, incarceration, and thoughts of suicide. We assist those with the day-to-day challenges of their mental health and transitioning from homelessness to being able to pursue a safe, healthy, and meaningful life.

Approximately 1 in 4 adults suffer from a diagnosable mental disorder each year. Over 5.5 million adults in California have a mental health condition.

TPF serves approximately 3,500 adults each year through its various housing, rehabilitation, recovery and wellness programs.

Our emergency walk-in shelter (Our Place Safe Haven) serves approx 55-80 homeless people from Ventura County annually.

Since our Veterans Transitional Housing Program became operational in Oct 2015, over 500 veterans have been assisted (with the majority successfully obtaining permanent housing) in the community.
