On average, in 2018, the cost of holding people in federal custody was \$102.60 per day per adult, or \$37,449 a year.

The average cost for psychiatric treatment in a community hospital ranges from \$3,616 to \$8,509, depending on the type of illness being treated. A simple calculation reveals that for an adult, the cost of 35 to 83 days in prison would provide the financing of a hospitalization that would have a better chance of bringing about recovery.

Turning Point Foundation is a local non-profit deeply committed to building a healthier community by offering compassionate and proactive treatment for adults struggling with mental illness, many of them homeless. Mental illness can touch anyone, regardless of their race, culture, income, age, or level of education. It affects one in four adults and one in ten children each year.

About Proposition 47:

On Nov 4th, 2014, California voters passed Proposition 47 (a law that changed certain low-level crimes from potential felonies to misdemeanors). The savings from reduced incarceration costs will be invested into drug and mental health treatment, programs for at-risk students in K-12 schools, and victim services.

Reducing criminal penalties for non-violent offenses.

- Offering case management to individuals with moderate to severe mental health and substance use.
- Providing resources such as mental health, substance abuse, housing, employment, mentorship, support groups, and education.
- Reducing certain low-level, non-violent felonies to misdemeanors.
- Offering a second chance to those who have served their time.
- Saving taxpayer dollars and reducing prison overcrowding.
- Investing in crime prevention and mental health treatment.
- Improving public safety by focusing on rehabilitation.
